As the year is coming to an end, I want to take this opportunity to thank the countless volunteers and organizations throughout Ward 5 and Calgary for their service. There are a number of organizations around the City that can use additional help during this time, such as the Women's Centre, Youth Centre, Food Bank, and many others! I would also like to remind everyone this holiday season to enjoy responsibly and not to drink or consume cannabis and drive. Let's stay safe everyone!

With winter upon us, City of Calgary crews are keeping an eye on the forecast all winter long, preparing roads with anti-icing solution before the snow falls, and maintaining City streets as soon as snowflakes hit the ground. Stay informed during every snowfall by following @yyctransport on Twitter and downloading the Road Conditions App for frequent updates. You can also stay updated with snow removal schedules and snow route parking bans in your neighbourhood at *Calgary.ca/snow*

The City of Calgary has approximately 5,700 km's of sidewalks and is responsible for clearing snow for roughly 10 per cent of these sidewalks. The majority of the accountability belongs to adjacent property owners. The City encourages practicing being a Snow Angels to make sure pedestrian safety on these sidewalks is maintained. Snow Angels are individuals who shovel a neighbour's sidewalk to be a good neighbour. A Snow Angel can be especially helpful to older adults, people with limited ability and anyone else needing help. Each year The City recognizes those who step up as Snow Angels. You can simply nominate a Snow Angel at *Calgary.ca/snowangels*.

You can also become more active and creative this winter by taking part in the City of Calgary recreational programs and classes. The Winter Recreation Program Guide is now available and registration begins Nov. 26, 2019. The City offers hundreds of fun, affordable programs for Calgarians of all ages, led by certified, professional instructors at convenient locations throughout the city.
